WHY GET TESTED



Rare genetic diseases of obesity are inherited

Some forms of obesity are caused by variants, or changes, in your genes. Genes are your body's instruction manual, passed down from your parents; they determine how your body functions and are also responsible for genetic conditions like rare genetic diseases of obesity. If you inherit a specific gene variant that causes a rare genetic disease of obesity, you are likely to develop obesity, even if you change your lifestyle or environment.



Family testing eligibility

Some family members of select individuals are eligible for testing through the program. Eligibility is determined by the relationship to the tested family member and the genetic finding. Eligibility may be found on the tested family member's genetic report under "NOTES."



Management possibilities

Identification of genetic variants may open new disease management or treatment options, potential eligibility for a clinical study, and/or a possible diagnosis.

HOW TO GET TESTED



Talk to your doctor

A healthcare provider must order the genetic test. Remind your doctor or other healthcare provider that you qualify under the family testing provision based on an immediate family member's test result. Please provide the proband number of your family member to your doctor. The proband number is a 10-digit number found on the tested family member's genetic report.

What is the cost of family testing?

Rhythm Pharmaceuticals covers the cost of the test for select family members of some previously tested individuals. You are responsible for any office visit, sample collection, or other costs.



How quickly will I receive results?

Test results will be sent to your doctor approximately 3 weeks after the lab receives the sample and completed forms.

What is the sample collection process?

The sample collection can be completed at your doctor's office via an oral swab or a blood test. At-home testing is also available. Ask your doctor about this option.
